Critique

I would like to thank Blackpool Canine Society for their very kind invitation to judge & of course the exhibitors who chose to enter their dogs under me. It was a small entry sadly too common with the diminishing entries our breed is witnessing these days. This leads me to my first observation, having been a successful kennel for many years I feel able to say, our breed is in trouble. I don't know whether we have got complacent or just taken our eye off the ball. Have we forgotten to learn about our breed? Do we actually know what our breed is? Having said this I saw glimmers of loveliness, type, quality, and functionality. I also saw flat splayed feet, Hare feet, stronger heads often with harder

expressions than we once had, heads should present a soft melting expression and be gently domed. Some tail sets were low, the Standard states carried level with the back or below. Inadequate rear movement either close or with no adequate length of stride or drive. We are the guardians responsible for this breed to protect and maintain it for the future. I don't want to see our beautiful breed depleted to the extent that it's seen as fair game for an easy ticket. Too many good people have sacrificed a great deal to get this breed viable and loved around the world.

Look at your own dogs, look at the standard. It's not about making up champions, although that is very gratifying! It's about making great Red & White Setters! Each an ambassador for the breed.

Puppy Dog - 1

1 Sherlock's Alanea Special One - 8m old, well balanced overall. Well off for bone, pleasant head not too heavy, good markings, head broad and in proportion to his well-developed body, correct stop not too strong, soft expression. Would prefer tighter feet. Good spring of rib, moderate bend of stifle, well developed thigh. Tail set a tad low. Moved ok but really needs a bit more ringcraft. BP

Junior Dog - 1

1 Tattersall's Carrick Shadow Dog At Alanea (Imp Pol) - 13 m very mature in good coat and condition, clean colours. Well balanced, good length to back well ribbed up. Good angulation front and back, well muscled. Good depth to chest and not tucked up. Skull a little broader than desirable, would prefer rounder eye. Good depth to muzzle. Adequate reach of neck. Feet could be tighter & tail set a bit low. Moved well, shown in excellent condition. Best Junior

Post Graduate Dog - 2

1 Whitaker's Oldestone Caught In The Act - Well balanced, good length to rib. One of the best heads today, a softer head broad but not so much as to be clumsy or hard in expression, a more typical red and white head. Softly doomed skull, correct muzzle. Good reach of neck. Correct angulation front and back. Well off for muscle and bone. Feet could be tighter. Moved ok covering the ground well just needs a bit more confidence. This dog has an uncharacteristically profuse coat which would benefit from trimming as it tends to detract from his quality and type.

2 Martin's Laoirebay Steel Blue Ocean At Shannonstyle JW - Another nice boy definitely a picture of balance and strength. Typey head, correct shape and depth to muzzle, a little stronger than 1. Strong, well-muscled neck. Correct front angulation, however just a bit loose. Good depth to chest, well ribbed up. Feet could be tighter. Would prefer a bit more turn of stifle. Overall a pleasing typey Red and White. Moved well.

Limit Dog - 2

1 Ward's Cornadore Argyle With Copperwhite (Imp Pol) - Mature boy well balanced has strength and power without coarseness. Masculine head broad but soft and gently domed, good stop not too abrupt, good length to muzzle with correct depth. Sufficient length of neck. Correct layback of shoulder firmly muscled. Good length to upper arm, well boned. Good fore chest, nice depth of chest, well sprung rib giving that 2/3rd 1/3rd ratio to body. Strong rear angulation, good width to thigh. Moved well showing strength

and rear drive with economy of effort holding his level topline on the move. Shown in good coat and condition of correct colour. A very typical Red and White. Delighted to award him his 1st CC and later BOB

2 Mcdonald's Roanjora Castelao JW ShCM - Another nice boy, so full of breed type, unfortunate to meet no 1 in such good form. Lovely typical head, broad in proportion to body but with softness and a kind expression. Pronounced forechest and good correct bone. Feet could be tighter. Good front angulation and well sprung rib, correct tail set and good bend of stifle. Moved well with long easy strides, covering the ground well, just not the body and coat of 1.

Open Dog - 4(1abs)

1 Cuddy's Sh Ch Taxus Golden Prince In Balbriggan JW - My personal surprise of the day. I've never so much as patted this dog before but a lot to like. He has a broad head but pleasant with correct proportions, just his lighter eye hardens his expression somewhat. He has excellent forechest and neat elbows, this I preferred over number 2. Good bone, feet could be tighter, balanced length of rib/loin giving again correct proportions, which explains his overall balance. Good width to second thigh, correct bend of stifle. Tail well set on. Moved very well, covering the ground easily. He's a different type to my CC winner but a good dog. RCC

2 Wade's Sh Ch Caispern Roddy Owen At Oldestone - Good overall type. Broad head, good stop, deep muzzle. Strong neck. Well off for bone. Excellent spring of rib, correct tail set. Good bend of stifle. Moved well. Very similar to my CC winner. I actually thought this chap would be my class winner, however just lost out as preferred the front assembly of 1.

3 Mcdermott's Ir Sh Ch Cilleigne Cu Chulainn At Drumlace

Puppy Bitch - 1

1 Ward's Cornadore Bia Becomes Copperwhite (IMP POL) - 8m old really quite a baby. Well bodied but could do with losing a little on the loin. Pretty head still a lot more work to come. Good forechest with a promising spring of rib and bend of stifle, slightly down on front pasterns, feet could be tighter. A bit unsettled on the move but its early days. Also a little proud of her tail

Post Graduate Bitch - 2

1 Ball & Harrison's Laoirebay She's Leaving Home To Siorrudh JW - Well balanced, very pretty head, broad enough and slightly domed. Good depth to muzzle, still retaining her feminine expression. Correct shoulder and well off for bone. Feet could be tighter good spring of rib and length of loin. Moderate bend of stifle. Slightly unsettled on the move but moved well enough.

2 Callaghan's Laoirebay Penny Lane - Litter sister to 1, similar comments apply, however this girl is slightly lighter in head with a narrower muzzle. Good shoulder placement and good spring of rib. Slightly lighter boned. Good length to body & loin. Moved well.

Limit Bitch - 2

1 Walker's Zendarric It's A Kind Of Magic Within Wroxham JW - Very showy girl beautifully presented. Slightly lighter in head & muzzle. Correct shoulder placement good fore chest Correct bone, lovely spring of rib and length to loin. Decent bend of stifle. Feet could be tighter. Moved well but not with normal handler so was moved too fast and was very distracted.

2 Wade's Oldestone Charlies Angel - Smart little girl, quite the powerhouse. Different in type to 1. Typical head, good reach of neck. Good spring of rib, slightly shorter coupled. Feet could be tighter will probably change places with 1 many times. A close decision.

Open Bitch - 1

1 Sherratt & Blackwell-Sherratt's Sh Ch Alanea Holly Fern At Charnborough - Mature feminine bitch, beautifully presented in good coat. Adequate head correct planes, good proportion skull/foreface, nice depth to muzzle, would just prefer a slightly softer expression. Nice reach to neck. Good shoulder placement however a little narrow in the brisket. Well sprung rib and length to loin. Good rear angulation, good width across thigh, correct tail set. Moved well in the heat, good coat and correct colour.CC

Veteran Bitch - 2 (1 abs)

1 Ward's Sh Ch Ballakinnish Mischief Making Copperwhite JW - 8 year old, very typey, old school. Correct skull broad but feminine, good stop still giving appearance of softness. Good depth to muzzle. Strong neck not too long. Good front angulation, correct fore chest and good width of brisket. Plenty of substance without lumber. Well off for bone, feet could be tighter, correct spring of rib, level topline. Good rear angulation, correct tail set. Moved well not quite the vigour of 1. RCC
