This club is about the breed and its members so that will always be the top priority in my mind and while showing is the most participative side of the club I would like to see a wider aspect to our activities as we often see successes and other stories from members and red and whites involved in agility, obedience, working and now Canicross as it gains in popularity, so watch this space.

A Data Protection change has been introduced under EU regulations and for this purpose I have included in the newsletter a statement about how we use and protect your personal data. We are now required to tell you this under the new regulation which commenced on the 25th May 2018. You may already have seen some of this through the many businesses and retailers that you deal with in your everyday life. Full details can be found on Page 19.

You are aware that we had to postpone the spring show at Steventon for safety reasons in view of the appalling weather conditions but this was re-arranged for the 13th May at Wendlebury Village, near Bicester. I hope that all exhibitors entered at Steventon were made aware of this although by the time you read this the event will have happened, and we now look forward to our Championship Show in June at Three Counties Showground alongside the Three Counties Show, about which details have been put out.

As to my previous role as Treasurer & Membership Secretary I just want to thank everyone who has renewed their membership and for continuing to support the club, some for many, many years even though you might not still have a red and white but maintain an interest. Also and especially to our overseas members who support us from places as far away as Australia, USA, Canada, and our neighbours in Europe, namely Finland, Germany, Denmark and Poland. Please keep us informed about your successes, litters, and stories of red and whites and we will get them into the newsletters through Roxanne.

Susan Barry is about to work her magic again as the biannual yearbook starts to be prepared so look out for the advertisement forms and get your dogs successes published. This is the clubs historical record of the breed so it is important to include as much as possible.

To add to the marvellous and active discussion at last years AGM, Shelagh kept you up to date with progress on the two working parties that were set up to look at the future of the breed. One to look into a sperm bank and semen storage and one to promote the breed. Not to repeat what Shelagh has said in her AGM update but the sperm bank has taken a back seat at present as our research has shown a very high cost and a complexity of operation, however, we have not given up on this route and we are looking at other companies that could offer facilities for the process and at having a stud dog register.

Promotion of the breed has got off to a great start with articles in Kennel Club literature, National and Dog Press features, and we intend to continue to support Game Fairs, Discover Dogs, and other dog and pet events as they arise. In addition we are about to go to press on our own puppy booklet which will be available to everyone. Other literature is being prepared for our events, look out for these very soon.

Please don't forget that "communication is a two way process" as Graham Bayne reminded us of in a previous newsletter so please do get in touch with any member of the committee, details of whom are on the website, with anything you think we should be dealing with. I promise a response.

And just to finish on a quotation from Ann Gormley that I'm sure she will not mind me printing, "to own an Irish Red and White Setter is not just for the glory of winning in the show ring but to be part of its history, to understand a breed that was almost extinct"

2018 Championship Show Points Competition

The Championship Show Club Points Competition has been reviewed for the first time since its inception many years ago. A few things have changed in the show world and we have tried to reflect this in the changes by;

- Giving points for various group placing's including puppy and veteran
- Points are now awarded for each class down to VHC to give more people a chance to accumulate points
- The range of points differs depending on whether it is a Championship Show with CCs on offer, Championship Shows without CCs on offer, and Club Open Shows
- Points are not currently awarded for AVNSC at Championship Shows.



Rosettes are awarded by the Club to member's dogs for;

- 1st to 10th place
- Top Overall
- Top Dog or Bitch
- Top Puppy
- Top Veteran
- Top Working, from working or field trial classes at shows ***NEW category***

Rosettes are also awarded to dogs who gain the following titles or any other awards that the Kennel Club issues:

- Show Champions
- Junior Warrant winners
- Show Certificate of Merit (soon to change to Show Certificate of Excellence)
- Veterans Warrant (which can start being claimed in 2019)

We will review more regularly to try and be more inclusive of awards that people might appreciate and be encouraged by.

There is also an award for;

- Top Breeder
- Top Stud Dog
- Top Brood Bitch

The biggest change comes in these categories with a change from purely cumulative points to rewarding the higher honours in a similar points method the dog papers have used. For example, dogs winning a CC or RCC and Best of Sex or Best Opposite.

Winners of top breeder, stud or brood must be members of the club at the beginning of the point's year to qualify. However, dogs they have bred do not have to be owned by members for them to collect the points.

Details and the points scoring system can be found on the Club website and updates will be posted on a regular basis on the website and reported in Our Dogs breed notes.

Baking corner

These scrummy biscuits are a winner for a lot of dogs. If you try the recipe, why not share photos of your Red & White enjoying them, or do you have a winning recipe to share? Send it in!

Bacon Cookies

Ingredients

255g natural creamy peanut butter
180ml non fat milk
1 large egg
244g whole wheat flour (measured correctly)
1 tablespoon baking powder
30g oats
2-3 strips cooked bacon, chopped



Directions

1. Preheat oven to 325°F (163°C, Gas Mark 3). Line two large baking sheets with parchment paper or silicone baking mats.
2. In a large bowl, gently mix the peanut butter, milk, and egg together
3. Add the flour and baking powder. You may need to turn the dough out onto a floured work surface and use your hands to work in the flour.
4. Mix in the oats and bacon. The dough is extremely thick and heavy
5. Roll using a floured rolling pin to 1/4" thickness
6. Cut into shapes using cookie cutters or a knife.
7. Arrange on the baking sheets and bake for 18-20 minutes, or until very lightly browned on the bottom. Remove from the oven, and flip the treats to bake the other side for 10-12 more minutes
8. Allow to cool completely before serving to your pup.

You can store the treats in an air-tight container at room temperature or in the refrigerator for up to 1 week. They freeze well where they can be stored for up to 2 months.
